



## WHAT TO DO IF YOUR DISK IS NOT WORKING

If you receive an error when using this disk, this may be because the disk is not spinning freely within its jacket. To correct this problem you need to flatten the sides of the disk, raising the jacket away from the disk's surface. Follow these steps:

- 1) Grasp the disk by two corners and hold it upright at the edge of a desktop (Fig. 1).
- 2) Pressing lightly, draw the side of the disk against the edge of the desktop (Fig. 2).
- 3) Repeat steps 1 and 2 for each side. Take care when passing the write-protect notch and the two notches near the disk window.

The disk is now ready for use. If the disk continues to fail, we will be happy to send you another. For a replacement simply return your defective disk to:
