Getting Started with The Fancy Font ${}^{\rm TM}$ System

	Follow these directions for a quick introduction to using the Songy Sond System:	
	1.	Connect your printer and computer and turn on both machines.
•	2.	Select a CP/M system disk and insert in drive A.
	3.	Insert Disk 1 of the Sancy Sont System in drive B.
	4.	Log to drive B (type underlined characters;) is carriage return) A> $\underline{B:}$
	5.	Print a help file for starters: B> <u>Pfont Pfont.hlp</u> +fo <u>Romn12</u> After several seconds of initialization and processing, your printer should start printing a help file in the 12 pt. Roman font.
	6.	Now an example to show you more <i>Sangy Sont</i> features, type: B> <u>Pfont Sample.ff</u> +fo <u>Romn12 RomnB12</u> <u>RomnI12</u>
	7.	Faster, but rough draft printing, can be achieved by typing: B> <u>Pfont Sample ff +fo Romn12 RomnB12 RomnI12 +rd 12</u>
	8.	Look at the contents of the file 'Sample ff' with an editor and compare with the printed output.
	9.	Experiment with the file 'Sample.ff' and switching the order of fonts in steps 6 & 7, for example: B> <u>Pfont Sample.ff +fo RomnI12 Romn12 RomnB12</u>
	10.	Read the manual and remember to use '?' for help. For example: B> <u>Pfont</u> 2
		>> <u>?</u>
		>> <u>+fo Romn12 ?</u>
	NOTE:	When using Pfont, typing 'Control-C' will always stop Pfont and return you to CP/M
