AT OUR FIRST MEETING..

THE FIRST MEETING of the group took place at 6:30pm, Thursday, April 18 at the library of IDA PATTERSON GRADE SCHOOL, 1510 West 15th Street, in Eugene, one hour before the regular monthly meeting of the Eugene IBM Personal Computer Club. There were about 30 interested PCjr owners in attendance. Efforts were made to reach (you) through an ad in the REGISTER GUARD, posters in the computer stores, personal contact, and Tom Drew of the BYTE SHOP helped identify some PCjr owners.

SOME PRELIMINARY DISCUSSION was held about what goals and objectives a PCjr group might have. Dick Page kicked the meeting off sharing some thoughts, and there were three PCjr systems set up. (1).128k Enhanced with IBM printer interface and a Panasonic KX-P1091 printer, (2).128k Enhanced unit with the Microsoft Mouse and 128k booster, (includes the printer interface), and a Epson printer, and (3). Pcjr with the RACORE 2nd disc drive and memory enhancement, Epson printer, etc. It was interesting to see the different configurations side by side.

WE DISTRIBUTED A QUESTIONNAIRE for information purposes, and if you were unable to attend that first meeting, we have enclosed a copy with this newsletter. 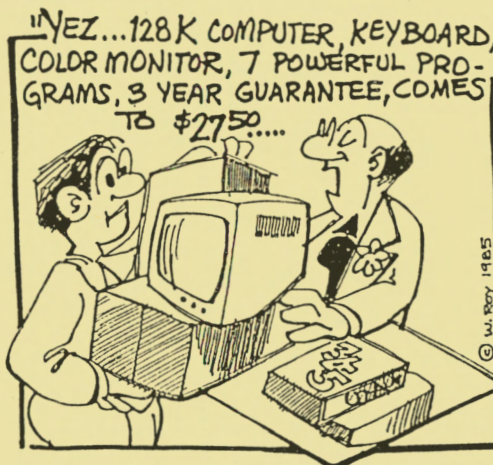

SOME QUESTIONS...

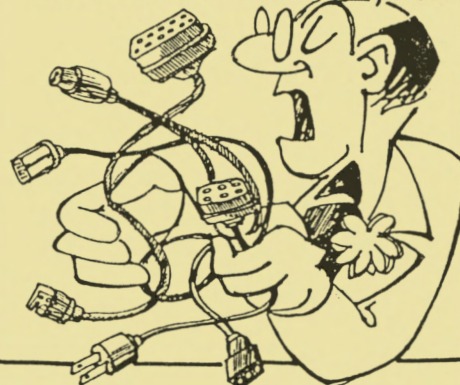

Dear Sir:

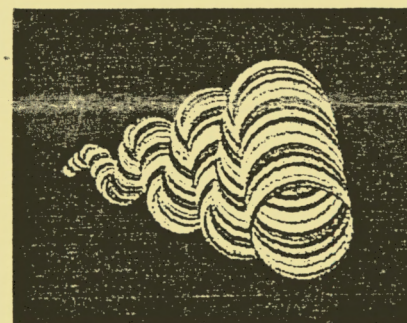
